

# Chair's Report August 2021


July and August have bought the reminder of winter for sure this week– and nothing says 'spring' more than the arrival of triplet lambs in the pouring rain and 2c!! Nature is cruel sometimes. What the rain has done is help fill the lake a little – after a dry summer.

Your LŌCA team continue to focus on what it can do to support and improve the community we all live in. Following our strategy, we are working on each aspect with intensity and with some progress.

#### **Water Quality**

We continue to monitor and work with agencies to ensure our water quality is improving. Please check this website for up-to-date information - Water quality dashboard link: https://www.rotorualakes.co.nz/vdb/document/1797

Our understanding from BOPRC, is the work on the outlet pipe will be completed in October and the lake levels will then be managed and monitored as per their normal ranges. It is hoped that we do get a little more water in the lake, however the new pipe work will help improve the correct flow of water and assist the management of this. We will continue to work towards the new ongoing long-term consent for this now this work has been completed.

The lake spraying continues and has proved to be effective in helping improve the quality of the water. We are extending this to further conversations with BOPRC, to adopt an already approved plan to remove the lake of all non-native weeds and show case Lake Ōkāreka as the lake with the most improved lake quality in NZ. There is much interest in the performance of our lake, so we are developing strong relationships with partners that will assist us achieve this aspiration.

#### **Plant Pests**

Climbing Spindleberry – continues to be our number one plant pest this year, unfortunately we missed the opportunity to get drone footage of where it is located here, to help us put together a community plan of eradications. Cherry Trees – clearly these are a pest plant that we need to work on. We have some strong support from a community member who has kindly provided us with some research and background information on this species. We are working through this currently and will provide further information on how we are going to attack this once a plan is agreed.

It is important to remember that although our goal is to return our surroundings to native bush as much as possible, total eradication is not going to happen overnight and will take all of us to be a part of the solution. Some of the cherry species, are admired and adored and this is understandable. What we need to do is help to educate and share our knowledge to help remove as many of these wayward species as possible.



## Status as a pest plant in the Bay of Plenty

Climbing spindleberry is a Containment Pest Plant in the Bay of Plenty Regional Pest Management Plan.

Rules require land occupiers to destroy any climbing spindleberry on their properties.

It is an offence under the Biosecurity Act to propagate, sell, distribute, release or spread climbing spindleberry in the Bay of Plenty.

Assistance may be available from Bay of Plenty Regional Council by way of approved programmes.

#### How do I get rid of it?

**Spraying:** Use for scrambling plants that are not climbing high into other vegetation in late spring and summer.

Spray with triclopyr (e.g. Grazon or Agpro Triclop).

With knapsack or CDAX unit use 60 ml per 10 L of water.

With Handgun use 300 ml per 100 L of water.

Add penetrant (e.g. Organosilicone or Pulse) to the spray mix. Use 10 ml per 10 L spray mix.

Stump treatment: Use during spring and summer for large plants growing high into other vegetation.

Use glyphosate (e.g. Roundup®) at the rate of 1 part glyphosate to 4 parts water (e.g.1 cup to 4 cups).

Cut the vines, leaving about 200 mm above the ground.

Apply herbicide mix liberally to the cut surface and sides of the stump to ground level using a small trigger sprayer or knapsack.

Or use Vigilant gel. Apply a blob of gel to the freshly cut surface.

Repeat treatments will be necessary for several years.



#### **Land Based Pests:**

Rats/Mice – ongoing trapping and recording of this data is the work of Tim Bell and his team. They have recently put out more traps and are working on the saturation of our village with traps to reduce the numbers as much as possible. If you wish to discuss this further or have a trap on your property - talk to Tim as soon as possible!

Lake Pests – no catfish to report so far!! Lake Ōkāreka is being monitored and checked carefully for this pest, including DNA testing regularly. Remember to ensure your visitors that use the lake clean and check their boat before launching into our lake.... And anything you spot, please feed back to us or BOPRC. We are assuming that those of us that live here are naturally doing this.

#### Cameras:

Our cameras have been installed now for nearly twelve months and as we understand provided useful information for the Police via the RLC monitoring. We have confirmation that the third camera will be installed at the boat ramp soon – and is being supported by BOPRC. Very happy that this will provide further coverage and support for the safety of our community and lake users.

There continues to be a level of 'unacceptable behaviour' – particularly down at the DOC camp – the cameras are useful but these undesirables still need to be reported to the Police,

even if we feel we don't have a lot of information. Please call 105 on your phone to get to the right spot and report what you have seen.





#### Speed in the village:

It is pleasing to see the new signs up – and I hope that you are all abiding by the 'slow down' message, I think it works – we would be interested in your feedback if you have any. Peter is continually discussing speed reductions – the best we can do is keep this in the front of the minds of RLC, and provide them with the evidence we need to get this looked at again. We are assured it is on their radar!!

#### Camps:

Both of our camps are witnessing the reduction of users, and certainly higher expectations from NZ campers. The committee are continuing to work hard to keep both sites clean and tidy, including the removal of the greenery on the driveway down to the DOC camp. We must remember the differences between both camps, and what they provide. We are lucky there are two options for visitors!!

There are challenges with our camps, that we will continue find solutions for – where we can. We URGENTLY need more camp collectors, so please if you have a bit of time and can commit to something that effectively feeds back to support our community we would love to hear from you. We will keep you posted on this idea.

## Lake Ōkāreka Volunteer Rural Fire

The last few months have been less hectic for the Lake Ōkāreka Fire Brigade compared with the start of the year. The official opening event for the new station took place on 20 March with brigade members, FENZ management, Fire and Emergency Board Chair Paul Swain, Rotorua Energy Charitable Trust's Tony Gill, Councillor Dave Donaldson, local iwi and Lake Ōkāreka residents in attendance. Fenella Playne, Peter Harding and Martin Caughey provided a memorable connection to the humble beginnings, history and progress of the Lake Ōkāreka rural fire brigade and past members. Following the presentation of two plaques for the station, the new building was officially opened by the Internal Affairs Minister, the Hon. Jan Tinetti, assisted by Fenella and myself. A special thank you to local kaumātua Wairangi Jones and Pererika Mahika for their support and overseeing the proceedings.

A key focus for the Lake Ōkāreka Volunteer Fire Brigade over the next 12 months is realigning systems, processes, operational requirements, and brigade management functions to the new facility, including the future operational growth, capability development and direction of the brigade.

The new facility has already been well used as a community hub during the first half of 2021 with several meetings and workshops being held by various groups such as Lake Ōkāreka Community Association (LOCA), Landcare

Ōkāreka, Department of Conservation, and a lakes water quality group. The new facility has also hosted FENZ regional and national leadership meetings and workshops.

Use of the facility is available to the Ōkāreka community, however, it is not available for parties and social functions. Please contact me for any booking enquiries. We are also exploring options for cleaning of the station – any suggestions or recommendations would be welcome.

Various brigade members, including newer recruits, have been attending formal training courses over recent months. In addition to this, firefighter crews also attended two live vegetation burns on Mount Ngongotaha. The first burn was lit by hand; the second burn also used a helicopter for aerial ignition of certain areas of vegetation. The controlled burns provide an invaluable practical training experience for firefighters in terms of the planning and preparation for such events, fire behaviour and environmental factors, and fire containment and control. The live burns also provided key learnings on how to use fire as a tool for fire risk reduction.

It is that time of the year when certain members of the brigade get deployment-ready by undertaking annual medical and fitness tests requirements. Overseas deployments continue to be impacted by COVID and quarantine implications. However, national deployments are equally important as we head towards summer and being prepared is of paramount importance.

On another note, the Lake Ōkāreka Fire Brigade has been asked to assist LŌCA with the community firework display being planned for 6 November. A date to look forward to.

Finally, with the colder nights and wintery weather, please be aware of the conditions and take when the roads are icy, wet or greasy. Also, make sure to clean your chimneys if they are being used frequently and haven't been swept for a while.

# Tikitapu Pest Control Report

Tikitapu Volunteers have been busy over the past 3 months and have completed getting bait lines trimmed and marked, and the bait stations checked, ready to commence baiting mid-August. Following successful trials conducted by Dave Edwards in Otanewainuku, "running boards" have been positioned at the 50 Sentinel possum traps around the perimeter of the reserve. The kill rate was found to be markedly increased with these boards in place, as the possums liked to sit at the base of the trap and study it, before putting their heads in to access the bait.

Monthly checks have been done on the Nature and Mistletoe tracks and any trimming or clearance of windfalls attended to. The Sentinel traps (possum) and DOC 200 traps (rats) have been checked, cleared, reset and any kills recorded, twice a month.

This year the pesticides to be used are Double Tap, a toxin containing both Diphacinone and Cholecalciferol, targeting both rats and possums. From August 15th 2021 until the end of September 2021, Double Tap bait will be placed in bait stations, which are made of white plastic and attached to the base of the trees. Bait will be topped up as required over the next 3 weeks.

If post baiting monitoring still shows high possum numbers, Feratox® bait bags (encapsulated form of Cyanide), will be put out, targeting possums. These will be placed into Romark bait stations on or just after 17th October 2021.

Romark bait stations are made of white plastic and are nailed to trees. We ask that these are not interfered with and any spilled bait must not be touched. Feratox® is a controlled substance and will be handled only by certified operators. Uneaten Double Tap poison bait will be removed by the end of September 2021. Uneaten Feratox bait will be removed by the end of October 2021. Possum and rat numbers will be monitored both prior and after the baiting to assess the effect of the baits. These dates are indicative and may change due to factors such as bad weather.

Warning signs will be placed immediately around the Reserve prior to the operation starting and removed when the caution period is over which will be February/March 2022.



\*volunteers with CSL required

Please do not touch any carcasses. Poison baits and carcasses of animals killed by poison baits are DEADLY to DOGS. Rat and possum monitoring will be carried out pre and post baiting, and bird monitoring is planned to take place in November. This project is dependent on volunteers and I wish to thank all those who have been involved over the past months. It is always good to have some new people involved in the project and new volunteers are most welcome. Working bees start at 9am and normally finish by 12noon at the latest. There is a "cuppa" and something to eat when you get back to base. I would love to hear from you if you are interested in becoming involved with this project.












## No pest fish or Catfish at Lake Ōkāreka... so far!

As part of Bay of Plenty Regional Council's commitment to keeping catfish out of Lake Ōkāreka, 37 water samples were taken around the lake earlier in the year to detect the presence / absence of catfish and other known pest fish using eDNA testing. The level of sampling undertaken is probably the most comprehensive conducted in any lake in New Zealand so to have no catfish detected as present in Lake Okeraka is a pleasing result. These was no presence of any other pest fish species, however 168 species of plants, fish and animals were picked up as present in the sampling, highlighting just how sensitive the science is behind the testing. 

# **Backyard Trapping Project**

#### M Update: July 2021 - Pre spring push

The Lake Okareka Backyard Trapping Team have been out on the streets knocking on doors and asking for your help. We are trying to set up a network of rat trapping tunnels that we can check on a regular basis to help us keep a tab on the rat population and gather data for our village. At this stage we are just looking for willing houseowners to allow us to put a trap/tunnel on their front boundary so that it can be easily checked by us without having to go onto private property. The traps are inside a wooden tunnel and are very safe for children and other pets. (see below image)



There is also a loan service for our Trapinator possum traps. So, if you have a noisy night time visitor in your trees give us a call and we can help you set up a temporary trap.

# Landcare Ōkāreka Winter-Spring 2021

Landcare Ōkāreka volunteers have continued with various projects and maintenance work around the public conservation land and reserves of Lake Ōkāreka over the past summer, autumn and winter. This has included weed removal (e.g. wilding cherries, climbing spindleberry, pampas,etc), preparation of areas for winter planting, wasp control, animal pest control, lake edge willow seedling removal along lake shore adjacent to the Lake Ōkāreka Walkway, on going long tailed bat monitoring, issuing rat bait to residents with rat bait stations and so on.

# Millar Road / Boyes beach wetland:

Throughout the spring, summer and autumn months some Landcare Ōkāreka volunteers have undertaken hours of weed pest removal and site preparation work, getting areas ready for planting this winter in the Millar Road / Boyes beach wetland. You may have noticed some large trees were removed adjacent to Te Waiariki Purea Trust driveway in to the recreation shed at

Boyes beach. These were professionally removed by "The Specialists" paid for through Landcare Ōkāreka's budget with BOPRC. We have over 3000 native plants coming to put in this winter. Some have come via TipuWai / Scion / Billion Tree project (thank you to Gregg Brown); some from BOPRC, Some from DOC and some grown locally by volunteers and donated to the planting areas.

#### **Animal Pest Trapping:**

The team of Landcare Ōkāreka volunteers continued to check and re-bait the traps along the various trapping lines around the lake edge and in the Millar Road wetland. We are deploying Sentinal traps for possums in some parts. As per usual we ask parents and children to take a responsible attitude towards traps if you should notice them. Do not touch or poke anything in to the traps. They are there for a purpose. And a huge thank you to everyone who is helping with this project.

#### Long Tailed Bat Monitoring:

This project has continued over the past warmer spring, summer and autumn months, with monitors being deployed in a number of suitable locations within the catchment. Some of these have been on private land and we thank those land owners who have been so supportive of this monitoring work. Following many hours of analysis of recordings by local volunteers, reports have been prepared and presented to DOC along with the data for the National Bat Recovery data base. Long tailed bats continue to have a significant presence in places at times, within the Lake Ōkāreka catchment.

#### **Planting Working Bees:**

There is one more planting Working Bee left which will be on Saturday 28th August 2021 over in the Millar Road wetland area. If you are keen to help please feel free to come along. You will need suitable closed toe footwear – gumboots could be good as area is getting wetter under foot. Bring your gardening gloves and a spade.

We are pleased to say that we have new volunteers coming along each time there is a working bee. We welcome anyone who would like to come and lend a hand. Lake Ōkāreka and its public conservation environment would look nothing like it does without all of the hard work of the Landcare Ōkāreka volunteers over the years. Thank you to everyone who has helped over the last 12 months or so. Watch out for the Landcare Ōkāreka signboards which announce each working bee. Or contact me if you would like to be added to the email list of volunteers.


